The International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) are independent skills-based assessments with a competition element. The assessments comprise tests in computer skills, English, maths, science, spelling and writing.

Over one million student entries are accepted from over 6,300 schools in Australia and New Zealand annually. In addition, students from over 20 countries including Hong Kong, India, Malaysia, Singapore, South Africa and the USA participate in ICAS each year.

Students wishing to enter any or all of these tests should register and pay by Tuesday 7 April 2015 at the Finance Office on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Hot Shots Tennis

Remember that students who register with Tennis Australia will receive a free ANZ hot shots tee-shirt and reception students who registers is also eligible for a free tennis racquet.

This year Plympton PS was lucky to be selected as an ANZ Tennis Hot Shots school as a part of the National Schools partnership program. As a result we received new tennis racquets, balls and nets for students to use to develop tennis skills within the school.

All students from years 3-7 will be involved at some stage this year in a 6-8 week program learning about the skills associated with playing tennis.

Since the school is involved in this program all students are eligible to receive a free ANZ hot shots tee-shirt and other offers from Tennis Australia once registered with the Tennis Australia website. Also any reception student that registers is also eligible for a free tennis racquet.

As an additional bonus for each student that registers and confirms their details with Tennis Australia the school receives funding to purchase new equipment from Tennis Australia.

DID YOU KNOW?

We are lucky enough to have a Gallipoli Lone Pine growing as a lone pine on the mound near the top end of the Old School triangle.

In 2005, 90 years after the first landing on the Gallipoli Peninsular, the Yarralumba Nursery, who collected seeds from the tree grown from a seed from the original pine cone planted at the Australian War Memorial Canberra, offered a small number of organisations, including schools, the opportunity to buy a small tree at a small cost. Our school gardening group ordered one and planted it out on Anzac Day in 2005. With lots of love and care it has grown in to a large Lone Pine to be seen and appreciated by all. We are now commemorating 100 years since the Gallipoli campaign, but unlike 2005, Anzac Day won't fall during term time so if we hold a special service it will be after Anzac Day.

The story of how our "Lone Pine Cone" came to Australia is a moving story on its own.

Two brothers fought together and one was eventually killed near the Lone Pine. The remaining brother sent a pine cone home to his mother as a memento of her dead son. From this cone lots more have been propagated. The Pine became the Lone Pine at Gallipoli because the Turkish army had cut down all but one pine to protect their trenches. In the 3 days of fighting the Australians lost more than 2000 men and the Turks approximately 7000.
